The Whaling Museum in Cold Spring Harbor is inviting Long Island students to write original stories about this pictured piece of sea glass as a part of its Sea Glass Fiction Contest.

Sea glass is found by shorelines around the world, having begun as discarded glass items such as bottles, jars, and plates on beaches. Through the years, ocean waves polish and tumble the glass to form frosted, unique gems. (You can hunt for sea glass on Long Island beaches, too!)

Can you imagine what story is behind the sea glass piece pictured above? Our judges look forward to reading and enjoying every entry. Winners will be judged on originality and creative expression, and will be highlighted at the museum's Sea Glass Festival on July 21, 2024.
